You do not have to complete the requirements in one day, simply manage your time and spread them out from **January 21 – March 1**. Any items to be submitted, can be placed in the Patriot Program box in the main lobby, given to a Patriot Program volunteer, or email/share with <u>seispto@sesdrams.org</u>. <u>Please keep the below requirements in your agenda.</u>

You must complete a total of 8 requirements. The following 5 are required, and the additional 3 can be selected from the list shown back of page.

	Five MANDATORY Requirements to be completed:	Completed?
1.	Memorize and recite the Preamble to the Constitution for a Patriot Program Volunteer on designated Writing Intervention day in Room 305 (solo or with friends). Worried you can't do it? Look up "School House Rock & The Preamble".	
2.	Sing, play or recite during designated Writing Intervention day in the Room 305: 1st two verses of America the Beautiful or one of the anthems of a branch of the armed services. (Words available on SEIS website or print copy available upon request) This also can be done solo, or with friends!	
3.	Complete a quiz of a list of political figures & their respective titles during designated Writing Intervention day in the Room 305 (Practice sheet available on SEIS website or print copy available upon request)	
4.	Write and submit a one paragraph essay (minimum of 5 sentences) about "The Pentagon" in Virginia.	
5.	Complete community service form and submit (form available on SEIS website or print copy available upon request). Photo of you performing the service would be great! (Examples: collecting canned goods for local food bank at school, cleaning out old toys and donating to Goodwill, making cards for children in hospitals, writing a letter to a service member, etc.) This may be done on your own, or through your local community organization such as church, scouts, 4-H, etc. within the timeframe of the Patriot Program (Jan-Mar).
