1.	Memorize and recite the Preamble to the Constitution for a Patriot Program Volunteer on designated RAMS period in the library/LGI (solo or with friends). Worried you can't do it? Look up "School House Rock & The Preamble".	
2.	Sing, play or recite during designated RAMS period in the library/LGI: 1 st two verses of America the Beautiful or one of the anthems of a branch of the armed services. (Words available on SEIS website or print copy available upon request) This also can be done solo, or with friends!	
3.	Complete a quiz of a list of political figures & their respective titles during designated RAMS period in the library/LGI (Practice sheet available on SEIS website or print copy available upon request)	
4.	Neatly write/type and submit a one paragraph essay (minimum of 5 sentences) about the "Franklin Delano Roosevelt Memorial" in Washington D.C.	
5.	Complete community service form and submit (form available on SEIS website or print copy available upon request). Photo of you performing the service would be great! (Examples: collecting canned goods for local food bank at school, cleaning out old toys and donating to Goodwill, making cards for children in hospitals, writing a letter to a service member, etc.) This may be done on your own, or through your local community organization such as church, scouts, 4-H, etc. within the timeframe of this year's Patriot Program (Jan-Mar).

• Create & submit a booklet about 3 American Patriots (your choice). On each page of the booklet include the name of the Patriot, their picture (drawn or printed) and a paragraph containing 10 facts about the Patriot you chose.	ne
• Submit a paragraph on the following topic: in your own words "What does it mean to be able to vote?"	
 Research a Washington D.C. landmark/memorial & submit information about it in a format of your choice (poster, clay, Legos, display, etc.) Please include 5 facts about the landmark. Note: this should be a differe landmark/memorial than researched for other requirements.
